REBIRTH OF DOWNTOWN DENVER* (* Denver, Colorado, USA)

Denver, the "wild west" was founded in 1858. Lower downtown soon became dominated by rail yards and various industries. By 1970 the area was mostly abandoned and housed vagrants. Through a comprehensive Urban Renewal Plan the area is now booming with office buildings, apartments, condominiums, cafes and retail, surrounded by several parks, bike paths, greenbelts and the Rocky Mountain Region's premier transit hub. Union Station houses train, light rail and bus transportation. Underground tunnels permit passengers easy access to various transportation areas without going outside. The Union Station Terminal, over 100 years old, was preserved and beautifully restored.

Welcome to Colorado members were treated to a fascinating two hour walking tour of the Union Station area conducted by a professional guide/engineer who was involved in the core planning of the renewal project.

Interest was so great that several tours were conducted, followed by lunch at a gourmet restaurant.

We spent the next two nights at a hotel in Edinburgh and enjoyed the Edinburgh Castle, The Palace of Holyrod House, the Royal mile,

The Scottish Museum, a literary tour and last but not least St Giles Cathedral including the amazing Thistle Chapel. This was a magnificent working vacation we will all remember because of the wonderful friendships we made with women from all over the world.




















Welcome to Washington Annual Meeting Thursday, May 28
