The Finished Quilt

Last summer the American Women's Club of Lebanon formed a quilting group that is very proud of its accomplishments starting with a discussion of quilting terms and necessary supplies. The group made five-nine-patch squares for the FAWCO (umbrella group of AWC) quilt that's raffled off annually. But, the group wanted to make its own group project.

The group chose a simple scarp quilt using pieces 2" x 3 1/2" that were ideal for beginners. We gathered up some small dark and light scraps and didn't have to worry about points meeting exactly. We finished this quilt and raffled it off at our Christmas Party and will donate the proceeds to Syrian refugees.

The group's final project is a lap or a baby quilt, using mainly shirting fabric, a soft cotton readily available in Lebanon. We will raffle it off at our Founder's Day dinner in February.

With newly acquired skills, the group will now begin working on individual projects.

Palliative Care, a new Medical concept in Lebanon

During their monthly general meeting the Women's League hosted a talk about Palliative Care entitled "Helping people live well despite their illness". Dr. Hibah Osman was the guest speaker at the meeting. Dr. Osman is the Executive and Medical Director at Balsam-Lebanese Center for Palliative Care and is an Assistant Professor of Public Health at the Faculty of Health Sciences at the American University of Beirut. Dr. Hibah Osman explained Palliative Care to the attendees; a relatively new medical concept in Lebanon. Palliative care is a medical approach that focuses on relieving suffering and maintaining quality of life in patients with serious illness. Professionals



working in this domain assess and treat all problems related to the illness and its effects on the patient, including the physical, psychological, social and spiritual. The patient and the family are part of the discussion. The goal is to provide the best quality of life as long as life lasts.
