
At the business meeting, Mrs. Orchidéia was re-elected as President of

recipients of BIWC's scholarships, which totaled \$10,000 this year," enthused President Janet Brady. "We were so pleased that Nova Southeastern University Provost, Dr. Ralph Rogers was able to join us along with Dr. Alejandra Para, Nova's Associate Director of International Affairs and Diane Schachtman, Director of Development, Office of Advancement and Community

Relations.

As everyone was enjoying dinner, Janet Brady welcomed them and introduced the new members. Then Deirdre R. Sours shared some of the plans for the upcoming "Night of all Nations Dinner and Dance," planned for November 15th at the GALLERY one Doubletree Hotel in Fort Lauderdale. Deirdre, who is Chairing the fundraiser, introduced her committee: Nina Britton, Helena Caplan, Mona DeWeever, Pat Friedman, Marjorie Gaffney, Gloria Lafont, Maria Emilia Salgado, and Chantal Valsecchi.

"While the "Night of All Nations Dinner and Dance" provides the BIWC with a wonderful platform to raise funds for scholarships for deserving female students at Nova Southeastern University, we will celebrate the international heritages, histories, customs, languages, and cultural differences of all our club members, as well as honor and cherish the common threads that bind us as American citizens," Deirdre noted.

After dinner, Alejandra Parra introduced the four recipients of BWIC's scholarships. Each spoke briefly about their course of study and what they planned to do after graduating. Recipients were Teddesiab Brown and Niesha Jones, both born in Jamaica and studying Conflict Analysis and Resolution; Greta Gubasci who is from Hungary is studying Law and Kristel N. Tiwari from Antiqua & Barbuda is studying Finance. Following their comments, a giant check was presented by Janet Brady, to Provost Dr. Ralph Rogers and Dr. Parra.

The BIWC has provided more than \$300,000 in scholarships, including the \$10,000 they presented at the dinner. "The women who have been awarded scholarships in the past, predominantly chose to return to their own country to use the skills they achieved at Nova," said Gloria LaFont, a long-time member of the club, past President and current PR Chair.

The purpose of the BIWC is to raise funds for scholarships, and to further understanding between the different cultures of the world. The various smaller events throughout the year offer our members a chance to socialize with other foreign born women, who now call South Florida their home. "The organization has been succeeding on their several objectives for almost 40 years," Janet Brady said. Currently, the BIWC has close to 100 members from 42 different countries.

Each year, the BIWC Board selects a number of deserving students for the scholarships, presenting a check to the President of Nova Southeastern University to be distributed to the chosen students.


Sister Club News from Welcome to Taipei






hanges – During 2013/2014 there were various wonderful changes in our organization, the most important one being the reorganization and
